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President's Message

A wise woman shared an article with me from Tablet Magazine entitled "It's Time to Show Up" by David Sax. Sax tells us that "Judaism requires presence. In fact, it commands it." We are not only a communal religion (think *minyan*), we are a community (think *tikkun olam*). And so, I got to thinking about what it means for us at Temple Shalom to "Show Up."

This is a time of transition and change at the Temple and our Board and Planning Group are doing a lot of reflection-looking at our past, and planning-looking to the future, but there is no point in doing this if no one is going to "show up." I know it's cold; I know the pandemic has changed our lifestyle and our priorities; I know we are all navigating the change; and I know that "showing up" does not always mean being somewhere physically in person, but sometimes it does. And while it would be wonderful to see the synagogue full of congregants at services and programs, there are also other important ways to "show up."

The synagogue's role is not to be there <u>for you</u> just when you need it. You are Temple Shalom. The synagogue is made up of members; its strength comes from a community of <u>engaged</u> members who "show up." Showing up allows us to have a shared experience; the experience can be anything, hearing sacred music, mourning, smelling latkes, reading the same book, seeing a movie, packing lunches, serving on a committee or the board...anything we do together. It gives us the opportunity to schmooze over coffee, chat about family and get to know people in ways we can't online or in print.

Right now, "showing up" also means letting us know your vision for **our** future. Judaism gives us all so much, but the benefits come with obligations and responsibilities, and if we are to survive as a people and a community, among the most important, is "showing up."


