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Rabbi's Message

Rosh Hashana welcomed in a new year only two months ago, and soon enough we will ring in another new year. We are always moving forward it seems, and invariably, things change around us. It just happens. It can be about being young and embracing new challenges in our lives, or new seasons and new opportunities. Or we might be greeting the changes with trepidation, like birthdays we would rather ignore, or changes around us that we wish weren't happening.

Temples go through this as well. I've seen so many changes since our family joined in 1990, 32 years ago! But our "oy vey" moments have invariably led to new paths. The arrival and departures of different rabbis and students were difficult in the moment, but instead spurred many of our congregants to skill up and step up to be lay leaders, to the point where it is an essential part of who we are. A long-time cantor departed, as did his choir, but from those ashes we discovered Len. Janet. David. A choir! Friday Night Lives, and Shabbat Alives, and a home where new Jewish music is composed, in house, and offered as a gift. Temple presidents have come and gone, as well as key volunteers and staff. But we are here!

This coming year will feature changes as well, as Judith and Ruth, our co-presidents step back in May, as do I. But there is an amazing Planning Group in place that have been meeting every two weeks, half its members from the Board and the other half drawn from our membership. It is extraordinary to witness the positive conversations about what sustainability means, what our authentic voice is, and how we might reimagine what our community will look like next June, the June after, and June in five years.

Rabbi Ed Feinstein notes that we are living in times of discontinuity, which is where Judaism thrives. "We won't build our synagogues of our future by working to replicate the synagogues of our past. Our tradition IS change." My profound thanks to those of you who are committed to this so important work on behalf of us all.

Explore a Modern Perspective on Jewish Life

This is an engaging 20 - session course for anyone interested in exploring Jewish life through a progressive, liberal Reform lens.

Open to all, this course is perfect for interfaith couples, those raising Jewish children, spiritual seekers, individuals considering conversion, and Jews who want a meaningful adult Jewish learning experience. We welcome people from all backgrounds and are LGBTTQ2+ friendly.

Topics include holidays, life cycle celebrations, theology and core beliefs, Hebrew, prayer, the Bible and other sacred texts, history, anti-Semitism and the Holocaust, Zionism, and Israel, the North American experience, and the tapestry of the Jewish people today.

Experiential Learning will be an integral part of the course with participants experiencing a Shabbat Dinner, a Passover Seder, and others.

Dates: 20-session course, taught by Sherry Wolfe Elazar, starts January 11, 2023, and runs through May 24, 2023, Wednesday evenings from 7:00 - 8:30 pm.

Location: Each month 3 classes will be on Zoom and one class in person, location TBA.

Tuition: \$250 for individuals, plus \$100 for partners. Students who are in committed relationships are strongly encouraged to register with their partners.

My name is Rose Tatum. I'm the volunteer manager with ENGin, a nonprofit organization that connects Ukrainian youth with English speaking volunteers for free 1on-1 online English language practice and cross-cultural exchange.

Since launching in March 2020, we've served over 10,000 Ukrainian students. You can learn more about our work at <u>www.enginprogram.org</u>.

I'm reaching out because we have an urgent need for volunteers and I'm wondering whether you may be able to help us spread the word. All English speakers are welcome to volunteer with us; we provide training and resources, and no prior experience or knowledge of Ukrainian is needed. The commitment is just 1 hour/week (volunteers choose the day and time). Anyone age 14+ is eligible, though our greatest need is for adult volunteers.

Volunteering with ENGin is incredibly rewarding, as our volunteers are making lasting impacts in the lives of Ukrainians by equipping them with skills needed to access better academic and professional opportunities and eventually rebuild their country.
