Rabbi's Message

It was a joy to see so many seats filled at our recent "Shabbat Together" service a couple of weeks ago. This 6 pm service, now monthly, encourages congregants and friends to bring in Shabbat together as a community and then have a long leisurely Shabbat dinner with our chosen or our biological families. And we seem to be getting it! The noise, the happy chatter before the service started, the three teasing reminders that I had to call out that we really, really needed to start the service – these were happy reminders of what it is to sit in community again.

Slowly and now more quickly, we are getting ourselves unstuck from the patterns of isolation that we learned from the pandemic that somehow became ingrained in us. I can't thank you enough for your quiet and steady commitment to Temple Shalom during these down years, but now, I invite you to step back in and celebrate the community that we have created together.

We are building and rebuilding our community and that only happens by the specific choices that each of us makes. "Community" itself is a choice and it is open to all of us to imagine and reimagine what it means to be part of the Temple Shalom family. Judaism is a participation sport, as my friend Sherry Wolfe Elazar says!

And we do keep reimagining. On Sunday, February 5, for example, our Temple will partner with the Jewish National Fund and Congregation Shaarey Zedek for a Tu B'shevat Seder at the Canadian Museum of Human Rights' Garden of Contemplation. (Registration ends soon!), And there is always a home for you at a Friday night service, or at a Book Club gathering or a Shabbat Together or one of our Tikkun Olam initiatives, or as a volunteer for things big and small, or, or, or...

There are truly no limits to what we might do or who we can be. And "we" of course means a whole lot of "you and you and you and me's."




