President's Message

As Jews, we are commanded to be part of a congregation, a community, a *Kehila*. My Jewish Learning states:

That it is no accident that the Jewish people call themselves “Am Yisrael” – “the people of Israel” - rather than “Dat Yisrael,” or “the religion of Israel.” The collective is an integral part of the Jewish experience.

So, we require a minyan of 10 to pray some of our prayers, notably the mourners' Kaddish; and we know from our Pesach Seder that we all (then and now) received the commandments at Sinai together, as a community. Outside the synagogue it is our responsibility as a community to educate our children, look after our health-both mental and physical, look after those in need, support the bereaved and much more. And in everything we do, we must always try to maintain the Jewish values of justice and fairness.

As Jewish adults, we must continue to study and learn and that often involves grappling with difficult texts and ideas. And since we learn together, as a community, sometimes we disagree and engage in healthy and lively debate. We are experiencing this now as we examine the crisis unfolding in the Middle East. At this time, it is important that we come together as a community, but that we not lose sight of our history, our teachings, our underlying values, the tradition of respectful debate. While we are part of *Am Yisrael*, *Am Yisrael* has never been homogeneous, and its diversity continues to grow. Each of us has a different history and background and a different perspective on the world around us; this is part of the richness and evolution of the Jewish people. But sometimes it means we don't agree; we have the same information, read the same texts, live in the same moment, but come to different conclusions. Our great sages, Hillel and Shammai demonstrated this often. But now we see members of our own community mirroring an alarming world-wide trend, seeing the world in black-and-white, digging in their heels, “hardening their hearts,” denying the legitimacy, and, ignoring the voices of others, both from within and outside our *Kehila*. This is not the Jewish way; this is not true community, and this will not lead to success or victory. At this time, more than ever, we need to support each other but we also need to listen to each other and remember we are Jews and life is messy but it is also sacred.

They are now partnering with Harvest Manitoba, Leftovers Food Rescue and other businesses, all of which are helping them to serve their clients. Instead, we will now be turning our efforts to donate to Main Street Project. According to their website, "emergency shelter and crisis services are designed to ensure emergency respite is available to those in distress without appointment. We offer safe, respectful and non-judgmental services to those who are homeless, displaced, experiencing mental health issues or substance use issues. Our doors are open to all. Community members may walk in, be referred by other agencies, or may be identified by the Street Patrol and directed to Main Street Project for shelter and other essentials." On their street patrols, they hand out sandwiches and other food.







We are building a Free Little Library in the foyer of Temple Shalom.



Yoga Shalom is the blending of two ancient spiritual practices. It pairs the poses of Yoga, a Hindu form of spirituality with the meditations and music of Jewish tradition. It is a gentle form of exercise and is open to anyone interested in relaxing their body, calming their mind and nurturing their spirit.

Yoga Shalom is meant to be adaptable to various skill levels and comfort levels. The program has adaptations for those with limited mobility. It helps us along our path to self-awareness, understanding, acceptance, wholeness and contentment in our life's journey.

In the class we follow a DVD that is led by 2 women who talk us through the postures and breathing and provide guided meditations throughout the 1 hour and 15 minutes of Yoga.


