President's Message

I love the city of Sante Fe New Mexico, it's art, culture, Indigenous influences, Jewish History, sunsets and so much more. Sante Fe is called "The City Different" and right now I am thinking that this year is "The Year Different" for the Jewish people, for the world in general and for us at Temple Shalom.

It has been another traumatic year for the Jewish people, here in Winnipeg and all around the world. Antisemitism is overt and sometimes turns to violence that I cannot remember ever seeing before. The Middle East has become increasingly volatile and the ongoing war in Gaza is devastating its inhabitants, taking a terrible toll on Israel, we have not yet seen the return of all of the hostages, and peace seems no closer than it did almost 2 years ago.

This has also been a dreadful year for the world in general. Democracy is in peril. For the first time in my life, there is war going on in Europe and like the conflict in Gaza, it shows no sign of turning from war to peace. The situation in the Middle East has ramped up and threatens to engulf more countries and their citizens. The environment is getting worse. Climate change is creating more devastation due to more flooding, more fires, and more drought. I could go on...

But it's summer and I cannot end this message with doom and gloom.

This is a year of exciting changes at Temple Shalom. After 6 years with us that included a global pandemic, Rabbi Allan is retiring and we are welcoming our new rabbi, Myriam Saitman. Myriam is our first Argentinian rabbi and while we have had female rabbis before, she is the first in many years and the only woman rabbi leading a congregation in Winnipeg. A new rabbi is a big change for a congregation; I can tell you because I have been on the board for most of the rabbinic changes the Temple has seen! We are also welcoming new board members, new and younger Temple members including some very enthusiastic children. And we are and will continue to try out new ideas. This is exhilarating and wonderful, but it will be a lot of work for us, for Myriam, for the board and for everyone who engages with Temple Shalom. I hope you will be part of this exciting "Year Different" at Temple Shalom.
