President's Message

This past month we lost a long standing member of our community, Danny Klass. In speaking with the family before his death and after, I was reminded of the following words about mourning:

How does one respond to the loss of a loved one? There are as many ways to grieve as there are members of the human family.

Some will weep incessantly; others will not weep at all.

Some will insist on a full seven days of *shiva*; others will observe three days, just one day – or none at all.

Some will seek privacy; others will find comfort in the company of fellowmourners and friends.

Some will talk, tell stories, or share cellphone photos unceasingly; others will listen or speak sparingly, with their cellphones out of sight.

Some will follow the prayers and blessings of a *shiva* minyan with fervour; others will sit or stand quietly and respectfully, with or without a *siddur* in their hands.

Some visitors will remain with mourning family members for a few minutes; others will make an evening of it – and every evening of it. And some, for reasons too complex to pursue, will not visit at all.

Templates for mourning? There are none. Each in our own way will experience grief and carry in us the soul of our deceased loved ones, thankful for their having been a part of our lives.

With our knowing about the escalating violence in Israel and in our neighbour to the south, grief seems increasingly to be part of life. I am happy to be able to look forward to Pesach with my family and to getting back to visiting with friends I haven't seen for a while. Taking shalach monas seems like a good way to start ¹ the process. Hamantashen are baking as I write.

As we indicated we would some time ago, we have reviewed our **mask policy** and think it is time to stop requiring masks at Temple Shalom. We are one of the very few places still requiring masks and there is a sense that the logic of the requirement no longer exists. We are currently requiring people to wear masks in the sanctuary, but the same people remove their masks when downstairs in the Social Hall.

We know that influences all of you, however, on balance, we have decided we will no longer require masks at the Temple. We will now recommend and strongly encourage people to continue to wear masks when in the building. We will continue to have masks available for anyone who needs one. We will reserve the first 3 rows in the sanctuary for individuals wearing masks. The new mask policy will go into effect on Friday, March 10 in time for Shabbat Across Winnipeg.


