President's Message

"VOLUNTEERS ARE NOT PAID – NOT BECAUSE THEY ARE WORTHLESS, BUT BECAUSE THEY ARE PRICELESS."

This quote from Sherry Anderson sums up the past, present and future of Temple Shalom. Don't get me wrong, we depend on our wonderful staff, but without our volunteers there would be no Temple Shalom. In the early days of the synagogue, volunteers kept the "sanctuary" in their car trunks, caring for and schlepping the siddurim, our portable ark and Torahs to and from services, and baking the treats for the Oneg Shabbat afterward.

They set up chairs for services and events, led services, offered adult education sessions, did the "business" of the congregation, and represented Temple Shalom in the community.

Today, our volunteers still do many of the same things; although we no longer need to move the "sanctuary" from place to place, volunteers are still shopping and schlepping, cooking, helping repair the world by making lunches and cards, gardening, leading services and life cycle ceremonies, singing in the choir, blowing shofar, helping with our modern technology, educating our adults and youth, and so much more.

Incidentally, they still conduct the "business" of the shul, provide leadership, and represent us in the community, nationally and sometimes, internationally. In sum, volunteers are everywhere, doing just about everything, and we need every one of them and more. We could not do it without them! If you have not yet volunteered, there are so many ways to help, we hope you will find something that inspires you to join this special group of people and volunteer in the future. The wonderful thing about being a volunteer at Temple Shalom is that while you benefit others you become part of a community of givers, and you too become a beneficiary.

We will be celebrating the generosity of our volunteers, who give so much of their time and energy to us over and over and over again, at a special service at 7:30 on Friday, May 17. Whether you are a volunteer or just want to support and recognize those who keep the synagogue the fantastic and vibrant community it is, please join us for that special evening.

In the words of Rabbi Hillel, a great Jewish sage and scholar: "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am only for myself, what am I? And if not now, when?"



Through song, prayer and words we will explore Yad Vashem's Central Theme for 2024:





We are building a Free Little Library in the foyer of Temple Shalom.


