President's Message

Who are we, members and friends of Temple Shalom? We Jews are at yet another crossroad, another time of reckoning, another time of profound loss. We think about our history, the numerous times others have tried to destroy us. And still, we have survived, sometimes through active resistance and other times, through sheer persistence. We try to make sense of the senseless, the unnecessary loss of life. On a deeper level, we continue to ask again and again, why us? What is it about the Jewish people, a miniscule fraction of the earth's population, that has and still makes us a target for so many? We examine our personal consciences and wrestle with our own sense of ourselves and our moral and ethical well-being. It is overwhelming. How do we respond? We show up to rallies and special services and programs and respond to many requests for financial support. These are important, but they are only temporary.

The solution to the survival of the Jewish people (and ultimately to Israel's survival) is to come together and to keep our synagogues strong. The synagogue is at the centre of a strong, thriving and lasting Jewish people. It is where we learn together, we celebrate together, we mourn together, we pass on our history and traditions, and we keep those alive. Here at Temple Shalom, we need each and every one of you. This is not a plea for money (although we never seem to have enough), this is a request for your personal participation and input. Things are quieter now around the shul as we recover from the intensity of the High Holidays and the festivities of the chagim. Your leaders are tired; we're taking advantage of the quiet time to reflect on our future. Please come together and join us at services and programs, and please, please, please let us hear from you: what's working? what's not? what would you like to see that you don't? what's our next step on the journey to a rabbi...." It is you that we need to keep us growing and strong.



Please be aware that there is discussion of suicide in the film. Running time: 96 minutes.


