President's Message

October/*Tishrei* was a VERY busy month! Rosh Hashanah, Shabbat Shuva, Kol Nidre, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Shmini Atzeret, Simchat Torah, Thanksgiving and Halloween...I'm exhausted. So now we enter November which this year, coincides with the start of *Cheshvan* on the Jewish Calendar. Traditionally Jews have called Cheshvan a sad month because it is a month without holidays sandwiched between all the autumn holidays in *Tishrei* and Chanukah in *Kislev*. I, however, am in agreement with a very wise woman in our congregation, Sherry Wolfe Elazar, and don't find it sad, I just appreciate the time to recuperate and reenergize before the next celebration.



*1 alcoholic drink included in the ticket price. Non-alcoholic drinks are complimentary, with refreshments.




